The Evensong service will feature the church's St. Cecilia Singers and choral music by Martin, McKie, Moore, Rawsthorne, Roberts, and White. Doff Procter will conduct with Scott Roberts accompanying. Former Birmingham chapter member and previous organist at the church Tyler Canonico is returning as the recitalist for the event.

**First Presbyterian Church, also in Tuscaloosa**, home of the 3-manual, 75-rank Letourneau Opus 129, is hosting **Wilma Jensen** for a recital and masterclass. The recital will be Friday, April 27<sup>th</sup> at 7 p.m. with the masterclass on Saturday, April 28<sup>th</sup> at 10 a.m.
